

## Mentoring has started

We are excited to share that the HABA - HYA Mentorship Program has officially launched in June, 2021.

In collaboration with the Hungarian Youth Association (HYA), we have matched 15 Mentors from HABA with 15 Mentees from HYA's community of current students and young professionals for a 6-month mentorship that primarily focuses on professional development, career advising and network building.

Mentors and Mentees were carefully paired by the Coordinators of the Mentorship Program according to their past studies and area of expertise and interests. Among all, law, diplomacy and finance were the most popular and frequent fields selected by both Mentors and Mentees, however, interest towards niche areas including machine learning or microbial ecology also occurred. Fortunately, each applicant's preferences were successfully met.

During June, the first independently organized online/offline meetings took place when matched pairs could get to know each other and plan common goals for the upcoming 6 months. As a form of feedback, we would like to encourage our Mentors to reach out to us and share their experience and first impressions in a few sentences. ## Studying in the UK after Brexit

Hungarian students will have to pay international tuition fees instead of the British one from September 2021 and there are many who may have abandoned the plan to study in the UK.

British universities have been opposed to Brexit from the start, from which we can conclude that rescue solutions are being made for the future.

One of these schemes, the Turing Scheme was introduced by Ambassador Paul Fox, Deputy Ambassador Richard Shackleton and Attila Molnár, Director of the British Council Hungary, to representatives of alumni organisations including HABA and British and Hungarian education experts at a reception held at the British Residence on June 30th.

After Brexit bilateral higher education cooperation and exchange programmes are supported by the UK's new international scholarship, the Turing Scheme. It is the UK government's global programme to study and work abroad. The scheme provides funding for international opportunities in education and training across the world.

## Hungarian Start-up to Help Students of British Higher Education

The founders are three Hungarians, Andras Geiszl, Balint Jakabos, Marton Kosdi-Kovacs.

On Bindr students can join study sessions with their peers to hold each other accountable whenever they lose focus or just need some company while working from home. Anyone can start or schedule a study session and other students can join or sign up for them. In the sessions students are on mute so they don't disturb each other, but they get to know their study partners by texting encouraging messages in the group chat, and possibly arrange the next session. With the current climate, it can be particularly challenging for students to interact with one another, therefore we aim to help them through their difficulties with a tool that enables them to study together like they would do in a library.

#### Máté Martin



**Máté, you joined HABA and its Board in 2017 when Elemér became the president and you are our Treasurer since. Máté, where and what did you study in the UK?**

MSc International Political Economy at the London School of Economics, and I graduated in 2013.

**Why did you choose to study in the UK?**

The UK was a natural choice for me – I went to international and British schools in different countries, it was therefore a natural progression to study in the UK.

**You came back to Hungary and worked here for a while until quite recently, right?**

Yes, that is correct. Previously I lived in Hungary and worked in corporate banking and the automotive industry. Currently I live and work in Vienna, in investment banking.

**Do you have any hobbies? How do you charge your batteries?**

I enjoy playing tennis, running with my dog, meeting friends, and going to concerts. Hopefully, we will be able to resume travelling soon!

**What other languages do you speak apart from Hungarian and English?**

German, Portuguese, basic French and Spanish

**You said you liked going to concerts. Do you have any favourite British performers, musicians?**

Jethro Tull, but generally I really respect how British musicians gave new life to American blues music, reinterpreting it, but at the same time making the old early 20<sup>th</sup> century classics popular again.

**Do you have a bucket list at all? What's on it?**

**Would you tell us what the biggest challenge was in your life so far?**

Deciding to live in Brazil for a year without knowing a word of Portuguese or anyone there. It was a huge challenge, but even more satisfying once I could get around and had built up a great group of friends. It of course it helped a lot that Brazilian culture and the people are extremely open, friendly, and welcoming.

**Drawing a conclusion from that challenge, is there a useful piece of advice, that you could share with other HABA members?**

Don't be afraid of change – I think there is an interesting difference between the American and European mindset, namely that in Europe we tend to be more wary of change and uncertainty. I've been the same way, but then decided to make a big career change to a different country, without first knowing how it will actually work out. In the end I felt it was liberating to put myself in a situation where the only option was to succeed. I think we could all benefit from being a little less cautious (within reason).

## The World of Big Tech

HABA held its springtime discussion on the exciting topic of the role of Big Tech companies in today's ever more complex world. The invited speakers included Mr Norbert Maier (managing economist at Copenhagen Economics) and Mr Levente Nyakas (head of the NMHH's Media Institute), while the discussion was moderated by HABA Board Member Zoltán Marosi. Mr Maier took care to discuss the competition-economics side of the issue (eg zero pricing), Mr Nyakas explained the media law / regulatory background to these issues, while Mr Marosi contributed to the competition law aspects of the topic. Afterwards, a Q&A discussion took place, where both the speakers and the participants discussed various further important aspects of this continuously evolving topic.
